Dr Fanny Salignac designed COMM1000 – Creating Social Change: From Innovation to Impact to empower students to become responsible leaders and the social change agents of tomorrow. One core idea that underpins the way in which she teaches this course is the belief that students are active knowledge creators rather than passive learners. An important aspect of her teaching is therefore to empower her students to take leadership of their own learning journey. To do so, she uses blended and flipped classroom methods that allow her to create an environment in which students are active participants and in which they feel inspired.

Dr Salignac's research and teaching aims to create positive social change for an improved social purpose system. Her research uses a complex systems perspective to investigate and address current social issues in Australia. She designed and teaches CSI's inaugural Creating Social Change: From Innovation to Impact undergraduate course for which she won the 2016 UNSW Business School UN PRME **Excellence in Teaching Award**. She also has teaching expertise in how corporates can generate profit within an ethical framework.

Fanny is a Lecturer at the Centre for Social Impact, UNSW. She has a PhD in Business Ethics and a Bachelor of International Business (Hons) from the University of Sydney.
